Maine Drilling & Blasting Partners with Habitat in Maine

Scarborough, ME, April 2019 – A team of 15 Maine Drilling & Blasting employee volunteers spent the day giving back by partnering with Habitat for Humanity of Greater Portland, Maine. The large build site encompassed 13 single-family homes to be completed on a 20-acre parcel of land. The day was spent on two different homes to be awarded to hardworking families. The MD&B team split into 2, one tasked with framing on one house, while the second crew was charged with sheet rocking the other. The two teams accomplished much in one day, as all the interior walls were completed in the first house, and all sheet rock was hung in the second.

About the build: Beginning in December 2015, Habitat's biggest project to date was to be completed in Scarborough, Maine and in 2019 is nearing completion. Eight of the single-family homes are Habitat program homes while the remaining five are affordable homes sold at market rate in collaboration with the Scarborough Housing Alliance. Selection of homeowners is based on three requirements: housing need, the ability to afford home-ownership and the ability to collaborate on site with their own sweat equity.
